A Visual Introduction to the 1843 and 1850 Charts

Similar

Two very similar yet slightly different presentations of the Ten Commandments exist in the Bible. These are found in Exodus 20 and Deuteronomy 5.

Similarly, the 1843 and 1850 Charts are very much alike. Much graphic and textual material appears on both charts. The organization of both charts is also essentially the same. Yet they are clearly different.


Each chart may be thought of as a vertical, explanatory time-line of sorts with oldest history at the top and most recent history at the bottom.



Ancient



The backbone of each chart is a centrally located historical date column. These columns each present, overall, a time period of 2520 years (from 677 BC to 1843/1844 AD).



Presentation of the visions of Daniel 2, 7, and 8 accounts for much of each chart. In both charts, the prophetic history in three Danielian visions is presented visually in approximate chronological correspondence with the central date column.



A Mistake

"The Lord showed me that the 1843 chart was directed by his hand, and that no part of it should be altered; that the figures were as he wanted them. That his hand was over and hid <u>a</u> mistake in <u>some</u> of the figures, so that none could see it, until his hand was removed." {PT November 1, 1850, par. 11}

The 1843 Chart contained <u>a single error</u> ("a mistake") – the date **1843** – which appeared six times ("in some of the figures") on the Chart.



The error was corrected on the 1850 Chart.
