## CLASSIFICATION OF DISEASES.

Probably the most convenient classification of diseases for the general reader will be as follows: —

General Diseases, and Local Diseases; Acute Diseases, and Chronic Diseases.

A <u>general disease</u> is one which is not confined to any special locality of the body, but is one in which more or less of <u>the entire system is involved</u>.

A local disease is one which is confined to some special organ or system of organs.

An <u>acute disease</u> is one which, with a certain degree of severity, <u>has a rapid progress and short duration</u>.
