

UTERINE DERANGEMENTS.

The uterus and vaginal canal are liable to several forms of disease. There may be acute or chronic inflammation of this organ, or there may be excessive menstruation, or suppression of the menses, or retention, or painful menstruation; or there may be displacement of the uterus, or cancerous tumors, or ulcerations, or leucorrhœa (*a mild, odorless discharge from the vagina that is clear or milky in color*) may exist. There are but few of these difficulties that can be successfully treated at home, and every patient who is afflicted with serious uterine difficulty should go to some good health institute where the principles of treatment advocated in this work are carried out.
