Remember...

"<u>Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy</u>. Six days shalt thou labour, and do all thy work: But the seventh day is the sabbath of the LORD thy God: <u>in it thou shalt not do any work</u>, thou, nor thy son, nor thy daughter, thy manservant, nor thy maidservant, nor thy cattle, nor thy stranger that is within thy gates: For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them is, and <u>rested the seventh day</u>: wherefore the LORD blessed the sabbath day, and hallowed it." ~ *Exodus 20:8-11 KJV*

"And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, Speak thou also unto the children of Israel, saying, Verily my sabbaths ye shall keep: for it is <u>a sign</u> between me and you throughout your generations; that ye may know that I am the LORD that doth sanctify you. Ye shall keep the sabbath therefore; for it is holy unto you: every one that defileth it shall surely be put to death: for whosoever doeth any work therein, that soul shall be cut off from among his people. <u>Six days may work be done; but in the seventh is the sabbath of rest</u>, holy to the LORD: whosoever doeth any work in the sabbath day, he shall surely be put to death. Wherefore the children of Israel shall keep the sabbath, to observe the sabbath throughout their generations, for <u>a perpetual covenant</u>. It is <u>a sign</u> between me and the children of Israel <u>for ever</u>: for in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, and on <u>the seventh day he rested</u>, and was refreshed. And he gave unto Moses, when he had made an end of communing with him upon mount Sinai, two tables of testimony, tables of stone, written with the finger of God." ~ *Exodus 31:12-18 KJV (Work of Sabbath reform to be accomplished in the last days- see Isa. 56:1, 2, 6-8; 8:16, 20; 58:1, 2, 12, 13)*

"And they that shall be of thee shall build the old waste places: thou shalt raise up the foundations of many generations; and thou shalt be called, The repairer of the breach, The restorer of paths to dwell in. If thou turn away thy foot from the sabbath, from doing thy pleasure on my holy day; and <u>call the sabbath a delight</u>, the holy of the LORD, honourable; and shalt honour him, <u>not doing thine own ways</u>, <u>nor finding thine own words</u>: Then shalt thou delight thyself in the LORD; and I will cause thee to ride upon the high places of the earth, and feed thee with the heritage of Jacob thy father: for the mouth of the LORD hath spoken it." ~ *Isaiah 58:12-14 KJV*

"For we which have believed do <u>enter into rest</u>, as he said, As I have sworn in my wrath, if they shall <u>enter into my rest</u>: although the works were finished from the foundation of the world. And in this place again, If they shall <u>enter into my rest</u>. Seeing therefore it remaineth that some must enter therein, and they to whom it was first preached entered not in because of unbelief: For he spake in a certain place of <u>the seventh day</u> on this wise, And <u>God did rest the seventh day from all his works</u>. Again, he limiteth a certain day, saying in David, To day, after so long a time; as it is said, <u>To day if ye will hear his voice</u>, <u>harden not your hearts</u>. For if Jesus had given them rest, then would he not afterward have <u>spoken of another day</u>. There remaineth therefore a rest to the people of God. For he that is <u>entered into his rest</u>, he also hath ceased from his own works, as God did from his. Let us labour therefore to <u>enter into that rest</u>, lest any man fall after the same example of unbelief. For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart." ~ *Hebrews 4:3-12 KJV; New Testament (See Isa 66:22-23)*

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The Mark of the Beast...

"After the warning against the worship of the beast and his image (*Revelation 13:16, 17;14:9-12;18:4*), the prophecy declares, "Here are they that keep the commandments of God, and the faith of Jesus (*Revelation 14:12*)." Since those who keep God's commandments are thus placed in contrast with those that worship the beast and his image and receive his mark, it follows that the keeping of God's law, on the one hand, and its violation, on the other, will make the distinction between the worshipers of God and the worshipers of the beast.

The special characteristic of the beast, and therefore of his image, is the breaking of God's commandments. Says Daniel, of the little horn, the papacy, "He shall think to change the times and the law." [Daniel 7:25, Revised Version.] And Paul styled the same power the "man of sin," who was to exalt himself above God (*2Thess 2:3, 4*). One prophecy is a complement of the other. Only by changing God's law could the papacy exalt itself above God; whoever should understandingly keep the law as thus changed would be giving supreme honor to that power by which the change was made. Such an act of obedience to papal laws would be a mark of allegiance to the pope in the place of God.

The papacy has attempted to change the law of God. The second commandment, forbidding image worship, has been dropped from the law, and the fourth commandment has been so changed as to authorize the observance of the first instead of the seventh day as the Sabbath (*Catholic World-March 1894: 809; Catholic Mirror-Sept. 1893; Father Enright, American Sentinel- June 1, 1893: 173; Catechismus Romanus- 1867*). But papists urge, as a reason for omitting the second commandment, that it is unnecessary, being included in the first, and that they are giving the law exactly as God designed it to be understood. This cannot be the change foretold by the prophet. An intentional, deliberate change is presented: "He shall *think* to change the times and the law." (*Daniel 7:25*). The change in the fourth commandment exactly fulfills the prophecy. For this the only authority claimed is that of the church. Here the papal power openly sets itself above God.

While the worshipers of God will be especially distinguished by their regard for the fourth commandment,—since this is the sign (Exodus 31:13, 17) of his creative power, and the witness to his claim upon man's reverence and homage,—the worshipers of the beast will be distinguished by their efforts to tear down the Creator's memorial, to exalt the institution of Rome. It was in behalf of the Sunday, that popery first asserted its arrogant claims; [See Appendix, note 9.] and its first resort to the power of the State was to compel the observance of Sunday as "the Lord's day." But the Bible points to the seventh day, and not to the first, as the Lord's day. Said Christ, "The Son of man is Lord also of the Sabbath." The fourth commandment declares, "The seventh day is the Sabbath of the Lord." And by the prophet Isaiah the Lord designates it, "My holy day." [Mark 2:28; Isaiah 58:13.]" {*The Great Controversy (1888) by E. White, p. 445.3-446.3*}
