Crucifixion and Resurrection of Christ - A.D. 31

#### Book of Matthew Written in A.D. 39 (8 years after the resurrection of Christ):

"In the end of the sabbath (7th day of the week), as it began to dawn toward the first day of the week (Sunday), came Mary Magdalene and the other Mary to see the sepulchre." ~Matthew 28:1 (Italics added for emphasis & clarity)

# Book of Mark Written A.D. 43 (12 years after the resurrection of Christ):

"And when the sabbath was past (7th day of the week), Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome, had bought sweet spices, that they might come and anoint him. And very early in the morning the first day of the week (Sunday, they came unto the sepulchre at the rising of the sun." ~Mark 16:1-2 (Italics added for emphasis & clarity)

#### Book of Luke and Galatians Written A.D. 56 (25 years after the resurrection of Christ):

"And they returned, and prepared spices and ointments; and <u>rested the sabbath day</u> (7th day of the week) <u>according to the commandment</u> (Gen 2:1-3; Ex 20:8-11;16:25-30)." ~Luke 23:56 (Italics added for emphasis & clarity)

"Then arose Peter, and ran unto the sepulchre; and stooping down, he beheld the linen clothes laid by themselves, and departed, wondering in himself at that which was come to pass. And, behold, two of them went **that same day** (Sunday) to a village called Emmaus, which was from Jerusalem about threescore furlongs." ~Luke 24:13 (Italics added for emphasis & clarity)

### Book of John Written A.D. 96 (65 years after the resurrection of Christ):

#### Book of Acts Written A.D. 63 (32 years after the resurrection of Christ):

"But when they departed from Perga, they came to Antioch in Pisidia, and went into the synagogue (church) on the sabbath day (7th day of the week), and sat down. ... And when the Jews were gone out of the synagogue, the Gentiles besought that these words might be preached to them the next sabbath. ... And the next sabbath day came almost the whole city together to hear the word of God." ~Acts 13:14, 42, 44 (Italics added for emphasis & clarity)

"And **on the sabbath** we went out of the city by a river side, where prayer was wont to be made; and we sat down, and spake unto the women which resorted thither." ~ Acts 16:13

#### Book of Matthew Written in A.D. 39 (8 years after the resurrection of Christ):

And very early in the morning the first day of the week (Sunday, they came unto the sepulchre at the rising of the sun." ~Mark 16:1-2 (Italics added for emphasis & clarity)

# Book of Luke and Galatians Written A.D. 56 (25 years after the resurrection of Christ):

"And they returned, and prepared spices and ointments; and <u>rested the sabbath day</u> (7th day of the week) <u>according to the commandment</u> (Gen 2:1-3; Ex 20:8-11;16:25-30)." ~Luke 23:56 (Italics added for emphasis & clarity)

"Then arose Peter, and ran unto the sepulchre; and stooping down, he beheld the linen clothes laid by themselves, and departed, wondering in himself at that which was come to pass. #### Book of John Written A.D. 96 (65 years after the resurrection of Christ):

## **Book of Acts Written A.D. 63** (32 years after the resurrection of Christ):

And when the Jews were gone out of the synagogue, the Gentiles besought that these words might be preached to them the next sabbath. ... ### Book of 1st, 2nd, 3rd John Written A.D. 98 (67 years after the resurrection of Christ):

But whoso keepeth his word, in him verily is the love of God perfected: hereby know we that we are in him. He that saith he abideth in him ought himself also so to walk, even as he walked. Brethren, I write no new commandment unto you, but an old commandment which ye had from the beginning. The old commandment (4th Commandment contains command to rest on Sabbath-Exodus 20:8-11)) is the word which ye have heard from the beginning. Whosoever committeth sin transgresseth also the law: for sin is the transgression of the law." ~1 John 2:3-7; 3:4 (Italics added for emphasis & clarity)

# Book of Romans, 1st and 2nd Corinthians Written A.D. 57 (26 years after the resurrection of Christ):

# Book of Ephesians, Hebrews and Colossians Written A.D. 62 (31 years after the resurrection of Christ):
